A. Introduction and Summary

- i. The PEMSEA Network of Local Governments (PNLG) Annual Forum 2022 was held in Tangerang Regency, Indonesia, from 26-28 October 2022. The event was hosted by the Tangerang Regency, in coordination with PEMSEA, the Ministry of Environment and Forestry (MoEF) of Indonesia, the Center for Coastal and Marine Resources Studies (CCMRS) of IPB University of Indonesia, and the PNLG Secretariat. It was themed “Strengthening Coastal Resilience Towards Sustainable Local Blue Economies”, and consisted of the following activities:
 - a General Assembly where matters related to the PNLG’s governance, policies and status of operationalization were discussed;
 - Technical workshops that facilitated knowledge and experience sharing among the PNLG members and other key agencies, partners, and programs in Indonesia;
 - Field visits that showcased on-the-ground implementation of the Regency’s relevant programs and corresponding achievements, particularly on habitat protection/restoration and alternative livelihoods;
 - An exhibit featuring relevant local products and good practices; and
 - A series of networking events and cultural presentations.

- ii. This event resulted in the following milestones:
 - The induction of new PNLG members, namely Gorontalo Province of Indonesia and the National Ocean Technology Center (NOTC) of the Ministry of Natural Resources of China;
 - The issuance of certification of integrated coastal management (ICM) systems of Preah Sihanouk (Cambodia), Tangerang Regency (Indonesia), Guimaras (Philippines), and Da Nang (Viet Nam); and
 - The launch of the Tangerang Initiative on Climate Resilience, which supports the implementation of the PNLG Strategic Action Plan (SAP) 2022-2030.

1.0 GENERAL ASSEMBLY

Opening Ceremony

- 1.1 The 2022 PNLG Forum commenced with the Opening Ceremony on October 26 at Atria Hotel Gading Serpong. H.E. Le Quang Nam, President of PNLG and Vice Chair, Da Nang People's Committee, Viet Nam served as the Forum Chair whereas H.E. Ahmed Zaki Iskandar, Vice President of PNLG and Regent, Tangerang Regency, Indonesia, served as Vice Chair.
- 1.2 Dr. Le opened the 2022 PNLG Forum General Assembly. He thanked the PNLG members for entrusting him to lead, together with Mr. Iskandar, this unique network of local governments which is one of a kind in the East Asian region.
- 1.3 Dr. Le also took this opportunity to thank Tangerang Regency, on behalf of the PNLG, for graciously hosting this year's annual forum and acknowledge Mr. Iskandar for his excellent leadership.

Exhibition opening

- 1.4 The opening ceremony was followed by the ribbon-cutting ceremony for a 3-day exhibit, led by the Minister of Environment and Forestry of Indonesia, Regent of Tangerang, and Executive Director of PRF. The exhibit showcased several Indonesian products such as virtual reality technology, processed foods, handicrafts, clothing, footwear, and accessories from 30 micro, small, and medium-sized enterprises (MSMEs).

Approval of the agenda of the 2022 PNLG Forum

- 1.5 Dr. Le called on the PNLG Secretariat to present the meeting agenda and requested the PNLG members to review and approve the agenda. PNLG Secretariat presented the forum agenda for consideration of the PNLG members. The agenda, as presented, was approved by the General Assembly.

2022 Accomplishment Report and 2023 Work Plan and Budget

- 1.6 Dr. Fang Qinhu, Deputy Secretary General of the PNLG Secretariat, Vice President of PEMSEA Network of Learning Centers, and Deputy Director of the Coastal and Ocean Management Institute (COMI) of Xiamen University (XMU) presented the 2022 accomplishment report and 2023 work plan and budget.

1.7 In 2022, the PNLG Secretariat:

- Conducted the 13th PNLG Executive Committee Meeting, which discussed the preparations for the 2022 PNLG Annual Forum, application of two new members, implementation of PNLG Strategic Action Plan (2022-2030) and 2022 budget allocation;
- Prepared for the 2022 PNLG Annual Forum by discussing relevant issues at more than ten online meetings and completing the preliminary work;
- Participated in the Technical Working Group meeting of the SDS-SEA IP and made comments and suggestions timely, promoting the development of the SDS-SEA Implementation Plan (2023-2027);
- Facilitated the membership of Gorontalo (Indonesia) as the new regular member and National Ocean Technology Center of the Ministry of Natural Resources (China) as the new associate member;
- Provided training opportunities for PNLG members;
- Organized the compilation of PNLG Profile and Xiamen marine development typical cases.

1.8 Total expenditures for 2022 amounted to 23,618 USD, which was partly shouldered by the Xiamen Municipal Government and the balance of membership fees. The funds shouldered by the Xiamen Municipal Government were used to sponsor the organization of the 13th PNLG EC Meeting, the personnel costs and the daily operational costs of the PNLG Secretariat. As the 13th PNLG EC meeting was conducted virtually due to the pandemic, no charges were made to the Xiamen account. With the approval of all the members, Manila account allocated 3,618 USD (estimated) for travel, accommodation and other related expenses of 2 PRF staff who will provide technical support for the forum, publicity expenses of the annual meeting, and the interpretation expense of the PNLG President during the 13th EC meeting.

1.9 For 2023, the PNLG Secretariat aims to:

- Organize the 2023 PNLG EC Meeting and prepare for the 2023 PNLG Annual Forum, to advance the work in an orderly manner;
- Encourage more cities, organizations, universities, and research institutions that embrace the idea of integrated coastal management to join PNLG, and to scale up ICM;
- Jointly provide training opportunities with other similar minded organizations in response to the needs of PNLG members.

1.10 The proposed total budget for 2023 is 56,000 USD, broken down as follows:

- 20,000 USD for the organization of the 14th PNLG EC Meeting, employees hiring, daily operation and capacity building of PNLG Secretariat to be sponsored by the Xiamen Municipal Government;

- 30,000 USD for training and information sharing costs, to be sponsored by the Xiamen Municipal Government; and
- 6,000 USD for international travel fees for PNLG officials to attend 2023 PNLG Executive Committee and annual forum, cost of experts for 2023 PNLG Forum and related supporting costs of the annual forum, to be charged against the Manila account.

1.11 The 2022 work summary and proposed 2023 work plan and budget of the PNLG Secretariat were approved by the General Assembly.

1.12 Dr. Le conveyed his appreciation towards the Xiamen Municipal Government for its continuous support in funding the operations of the PNLG Secretariat.

Implementation of the PNLG SAP 2022-2030

1.13 Ms. Nancy Bermas, Senior Programme Manager at the PRF, introduced the progress made in the implementation of PNLG SAP 2022-2030. The PNLG SAP 2022-2030 was adopted on 01 December 2021 through the signing of Preah Sihanouk Declaration during the 2021 PNLG Forum. The SAP has three major components, including Governance and Partnership, Management Programs, and Monitoring, Evaluation and Reporting.

1.14 In 2022, the network achieved the following progress:

- Expanded the PNLG network with the membership of Gorontalo Province as a full members, and the National Ocean Technology Center as an associate member, bringing the total to 53 members and 4 associate members
- Conducted the 13th PNLG EC meeting and 2022 PNLG Forum
- Enhanced knowledge sharing through the PNLG letter, a PNLG microsite, and creating PNLG member profiles
- Issued ICM System Recognition and Certification for 6 PNLG members (2 at Level 1, 4 at Level 2)
- Co-organized FISO Virtual Training on Sustainable Oceans
- Existing priority management programs continued, notably resulting in the development of the Tangerang Initiative on reducing vulnerability and enhancing coastal resilience in the face of climate change and other natural and man-made hazards
- Monitoring and evaluation tools and methodologies continued to be developed, with pilot testing in China and a PNLG tracking tool in development

- An improved reporting process, enhancing PNLG's visibility through social media, and including PNLG in progress reports at the East Asian Seas Partnership Council and other fora.

1.15 Mr. Iskandar thanked Ms. Bermas for the update and invited PNLG members to provide their comments or additional inputs and suggestions on enhancing the implementation of the SAP and encouraged the PNLG members to report their progress in support of the Action Plan.

Induction of Gorontalo Province (Indonesia) as the 53rd regular member and National Ocean Technology Center of the Ministry of Natural Resources (China) as the 4th associate member of the PNLG

1.16 On behalf of the PNLG Secretariat, Mr. Lin Huaiyuan, Executive Deputy Secretary-General of PNLG Secretariat, provided an overview of the review process and criteria for accepting the Gorontalo, Indonesia as PNLG regular member and National Ocean Technology Center (NOTC) of the Ministry of Natural Resources, China as PNLG associate member. The application was received in June 2022 and was reviewed by the PNLG Secretariat based on the eligibility requirements in the PNLG Charter. Recommendations were submitted to the PNLG Executive Committee, which approved the application in its meeting on 5 July 2022. Mr. Lin also emphasized the responsibility of Gorontalo Province and National Ocean Technology Center in observing the provisions of the PNLG Charter and Code of Conduct as a new member.

1.17 Mr. Iskandar called on the representatives from Gorontalo Province (on-site) and National Ocean Technology Center (online) for the signing of the PNLG Charter, and invite them to render a short message.

1.18 The representative of Gorontalo Province expressed his appreciation for the approval of the province's application as a PNLG member. Gorontalo Province government would like to share its ICM experience with other members and to seek new opportunities for cooperation with the members in making ICM work in Gorontalo.

1.19 The representative of NOTC expressed his appreciation for the approval of the institution's application as a PNLG member. NOTC will work with other PNLG members to jointly promote the practice and experience of ICM and make efforts to achieve sustainable coastal development in the East Asian Seas region.

1.20 The induction was witnessed by Mr. Ahmed Zaki Iskandar, Dr. Le Quang Nam, Ms. Aimee Gonzales and Dr. Suk Jae Kwon.

2.0 Launching of Tangerang Initiative

- 2.1 Prof. Luky Adrianto, Faculty of Fisheries and Marine Science, IPB University, Indonesia and Member of Advisory Board, Center for Coastal and Marine Resources Studies, IPB University, Indonesia introduced the Tangerang Initiative.
- 2.2 Prof. Luky Adrianto raised that they remained to share the knowledge and experience in developing, demonstrating, maintaining, and continually improving the application of ICM across the region through these following four actions:
 - a. Increasing the effectiveness of coastal and marine resource governance;
 - b. Improving the health of ocean of the region through the ICM scaling up;
 - c. Improving the health of people through strengthening the participation of the stakeholders and;
 - d. Advancing the health and inclusiveness of the economies through inclusive sustainable blue economics in the region.
- 2.3 On behalf of Tangerang Regency, the host local government of the 2022 PNLG Forum, Mr. Iskandar invited all our PNLG members to adopt the Tangerang Initiative as an affirmation of commitment to implement measures to strengthen coastal resilience in support of the PNLG SAP. The Tangerang Initiative was approved by the General Assembly.

3.0 Integrated Coastal Management System (ICMS) Recognition Ceremony

- 3.1 Ms. Nancy Bermas introduced the ICM system certification process and the results of the evaluation of the ICM systems of 4 PNLG members who embarked on the process with support from PEMSEA Resource Facility and the Ministry of Natural Resources China. Four local governments in this assessment were Da Nang (Vietnam), Guimaras Province (Philippines), Preah Sihanouk (Cambodia) and Tangerang Regency (Indonesia). The results of the assessment show that the ICM system of Da Nang, Guimaras and Preah Sihanouk respectively has been institutionalized and has visible stress reduction programs. For Tangerang, its ICM system has been established and operational, and it has programs planned and initiated. At the same time, the China-PEMSEA Center based in Qingdao, China also conducted level 1 and level 2 assessment for 2 PNLG members in China.
- 3.2 The recognition was witnessed by Mdm. Noraini Binti Roslan, Mr. Kong Vitanak, Mr. Lin Huaiyuan, Dr. Suk Jae Kwon.

- 3.3 Ms. Aimee Gonzales, Executive Director of PEMSEA Resource Facility called on the Deputy Governor of Preah Sihanouk, Vice Governor of Guimaras, the Regent of Tangerang and the Vice Chair of Da Nang People’s Committee to receive the recognition certificates, and hold their certificates for a group photo.

4.0 Closing of the General Assembly

- 4.1 As the PNLG Vice President, Mr. Iskandar delivered the closing remarks. He thanked for the suggestions of all of the PNLG members regarding the Tangerang Initiative. And he wished all the members could increase their communication and coordination regarding the PNLG Strategic Action Plan 2022-2030. Finally, he thanked all the PNLG members and the participants again, for attending the meeting online and offline, and congratulated the new members.

- 4.2 The 2022 PNLG Forum adjourned at 12:30 PM, GMT+7.

5.0 Technical Sessions and Field visits

- 5.1 An Integrated Coastal Management (ICM) forum was held following the General Assembly, with two sessions on the blue economy and on nature-based solutions. Such technical workshops facilitate knowledge and experience sharing among the PNLG members and other key agencies, partners, and programs in Indonesia. Similar sessions were held the next day on governance, ecosystem health, and knowledge management.

- 5.2 More specifically, the presentations covered the concept, history, benefits, accomplishments, enabling factors, challenges, and next steps regarding the use of ICM at the regional, national, and local levels to strengthen coastal resilience for sustainable blue economies with case studies on good practices, tools, and methodologies for replication, including those related to:

- i. Data collection, monitoring, and evaluation tools (e.g., carrying capacity assessment, remote sensing technologies, artificial intelligence, digital information systems, predictive modeling, assessment of management effectiveness)
- ii. Transboundary resource management (e.g., concerning water supply, fisheries, oil spills, and climate change)
- iii. Ecosystem restoration techniques and nature-based solutions (e.g., artificial patch reefs, concrete shelf tables)
- iv. Alternative livelihood and emerging industries (e.g., pharmaceutical products, biotechnology, renewable energy, food processing)

- v. Sustainable financing models/instruments (e.g., blended finance, debt-for-nature swaps, bonds, parametric insurance)
 - vi. Community engagement (e.g., traditional knowledge and law, participatory resource assessment, citizen science)
- 5.3 At the end of the first day press conference was held regarding the 2022 PNLG Forum and the initiatives of Tangerang Regency in line with the theme of the Forum. The Regent of Tangerang and the Executive Director of PRF served as spokespersons of the PNLG and PEMSEA, respectively.
- 5.4 Field visits that showcased on-the-ground implementation of the Regency's relevant programs and corresponding achievements, particularly on habitat protection/restoration and alternative livelihoods, were held on the second and third day.
- 5.5 A field visit to Pantai Indah Kosambi (PIK) 2 took place on October 27. PIK is a former site for shrimp aquaculture. To drive livelihood generation and economic development, it was later converted to a reclaimed site for residential, tourism, and recreational purposes. To support environmental management, cleaning of the tributaries and the sea was conducted and majority of the land is envisioned to become an urban greenery.
- 5.6 A field visit to Ketapang Urban Aquaculture was organized on October 28. As a participating site in the mangrove rehabilitation component of Gerbang Mapan, one of the coastal management programs of Tangerang Regency, since 2014, Ketapang Urban Aquaculture is beginning to reap the benefits from mangrove rehabilitation, namely improved water quality, restored shrimp stock, and cultivation of fish and crabs. It is also envisioned as a tourist destination.

We, the representatives of local governments and stakeholders of the countries of the Seas of East Asia region, have gathered this day in Tangerang Regency, Indonesia on the occasion of the 2022 PEMSEA Network of Local Governments (PNLG) Forum, mindful of our commitments and responsibilities in promoting sustainable, resilient and inclusive blue economies as called for in the PNLG Strategic Action Plan 2022- 2030, which provides local government actions to support the implementation of the Sustainable Development Strategy for the Seas of East Asia (SDS-SEA) and its Implementation Plan for 2023-2027.

We reaffirm our strong commitment as a Non-Country Partner of PEMSEA in implementing the SDS-SEA, which recognizes and applies integrated coastal management (ICM) as an effective management framework and a systematic approach to achieve sustainable development of the coastal and marine areas.

We will vigorously promote the continuing expansion of the PNLG as more local governments and stakeholders acknowledge the value of the Network as an effective platform for information exchange, knowledge sharing and

showcasing best practices and lessons in the local implementation of coastal and marine programs.

We remain steadfast in our commitment to share the knowledge and experience as advocates of ICM particularly in developing, demonstrating, maintaining, and continually improving the application of ICM across the region through these following actions:

- a. Increasing the effectiveness of coastal and marine governance through strengthening national and local coastal and ocean policy and institutional mechanisms, as well as building capacity of local stakeholders on effective and inclusive ICM implementation;
- b. Improving the health of ocean through ICM scaling up program based on effective regulatory framework and functional and structural adaptive policy integration, and implementing programs on biodiversity conservation and habitat protection, climate change adaptation, and pollution reduction and waste management in the coastal and marine areas to promote coastal ecosystem resilience;
- c. Improving the health of people through strengthening the participation of the coastal community and building stronger and sustainable livelihood programs for ensuring social and economic resilience, and
- d. Advancing the health and inclusiveness of our economies through building sustainable local blue economies and creating stronger partnerships between public and private sectors.

We will report on the progress towards meeting these targets in support of the implementation of the PNLG Strategic Action Plan (SAP) 2022-2030 using the PNLG SAP Tracking Mechanism during the Annual PNLG Forum.

We call on the PNLG Secretariat to provide operational support to the PNLG activities; the PEMSEA Network of Learning Centers to provide technical advice and assistance in ICM implementation and in convening joint PNLG-PNLC Learning Events; and the PEMSEA Resource Facility to monitor the actions and impacts of implementing the PNLG SAP 2022-2030 and to promote cooperation in education and training and capacity development activities related to ICM, in particular and sustainable coastal and marine development, in general.

We encourage international organizations, donors, scientific and technical organizations, the academe and the business sector to partner with local governments in their quest to develop, implement and continually improve ICM programs as outlined in the PNLG SAP 2022-2030.
